Dear Mrs da Graça Carvalho,

I am contacting you on behalf of the **World Coal Association (WCA)**.

The World Coal Association (WCA) representing the major global coal producers, would welcome a meeting with you to outline its recently published proposal for the acceleration of coal use energy efficiency – PACE. WCA and its members see the necessity of having a pathway to the decarbonisation of fossil fuels if the goal of keeping average global temperature increases at or below 2 degrees.

Many developing countries are building, or planning to build, new fleets of coal fired power plants. A report by the World Resources Institute highlighted that 1199 plants (representing 1400 GW) are anticipated across 59 countries. They are doing this because for them coal is the most affordable, accessible and reliable source of power. Other sources of power energy will make a significant contribution, but for many coal will be the cornerstone of their energy system.

WCA notes and supports the EU's determination to bring CCUS forward as part of the EU's own pathway to decarbonisation. However, it cannot expect many poorer third countries to accelerate CCUS deployment if they use coal or other fossil fuels for energy or industrial use. While in the longer term CCUS technology will be needed for all fossil and even bio-based fuels, this technology and its enabling policy and regulatory framework is not going to happen overnight nor within the next 15 to 20 years given the range of financial, technical and regulatory issues to be addressed.

Given these realities, WCA believes that the path to decarbonisation for fossil fuels such as coal needs an intermediate step – an acceleration of deployment of high-efficiency/low emission coal-fired plant technologies (HELE). The EU is already well on this road to increasing energy efficiency of coal-burning from an average of around 35% towards 46% and higher for new and anticipated build. Further, such planned investments are also “carbon capture ready”. The IEA's November 2013 Ministerial statement on Climate Change noted that where coal-fired power is used, encouraging the use of highly efficient coal power plants should be priorities.

Benjamin Sporton (Acting Chief Executive - WCA) along with Dr Kevin Bradley (Managing Director, Environment, Natural Resources and Energy – Hume Brophy) would welcome an opportunity to meet with you to outline the PACE programme and to explain further how we believe that this added step could play a vital and pragmatic role in paving the path to the decarbonisation of energy and indeed industrial activities.

At this time, Mr Sporton will travel to Brussels 16th - 17th February 2015 and would welcome any availability you may have, for a short meeting, around that time.
