III. Questions suggested by the different panelists

What is the Commission doing to support the uptake of renewable (and low-carbon) hydrogen?

By the voice of NGOs & civil society)

The commitment to a net-zero economy by 2050 requires new technologies to enter the landscape and be deployed at scale in order to help us achieve this transformational goal. Could you tell us then, how you see the role of hydrogen in this equation?



• What are areas of disagreement between NGOs and industry and what are places of constructive engagement with each other? Please give 3 examples of areas where we could seek to build a closer cooperation and a joint narrative.

- Do you see a need for cross-subsidisation to kick-start hydrogen developments, and if so what conditions would need to be attached to that?
- Building on the successful experience in natural gas regulation, what kind of unbundling regime do you consider beneficial for the hydrogen sector?

- How can hydrogen and gas be reconciled under the same regulatory framework?
- Why do we need a separate approach to hydrogen? Is hydrogen not a gas?
- How do we move from cheap oil and gas to cheap hydrogen? What is the missing link?
- What is the role of imports? How can we ensure their flow into the EU? How do we move from the hydrogen strategy to a hydrogen backbone?

- Which key principles are necessary to facilitate the development of hydrogen infrastructure?
- How can we finance and de-risk the costs of investments in hydrogen infrastructure?
