## 4. Presentation and exchange of views on Consumer Credit Directive

Baroness Thomas of Walliswood, member of House of Lords, Professor Udo Reifner from Hamburg University and Professor Dr. Edgar du Perron from Amsterdam University have been invited to attend the meeting in order to make a short presentation about the new proposal of the Consumer Credit Directive. As the EP is still waiting for the Common position, the Presidency could also inform the Members about the current state of play in the Council.

## Overview of the dossier:

The European Commission presented the new modified proposal for a Directive on credit agreements for consumers on 7 October 2005. As the Commission took on board a significant number of the amendments adopted by the European Parliament in first reading (108 out of 154 in the its First Modified proposal and even more for the Second Modified proposal), the Committee on Internal Market and Consumer protection decided unanimously on 24 October 2005- on the recommendation of the rapporteur Mr WUERMELING -, not to proceed to a (second) First Reading (as would have been procedurally possible given that the EP had been reconstituted in the intervening period). The rapporteur on the dossier in first reading, Mr. Würmeling, has since left the Parliament and has been replaced by Mr LECHNER.

The Committee decided therefore to await the Common Position in Council.
As there is no Impact assessment on the legislative proposal, the Coordinators of the IMCO Committee have decided to commit a study on it and informed about the decision the Finnish Presidency-in office on 13 July 2006.

Re: Impact assessment on the Directive on Credit for consumers: harmonisation of the laws of the member States

I wish to thank you for your presentation in the IMCO Committee on 12 July 2006 and for the useful exchange of views.

As we discussed on that occasion, following on previous contacts with the Austrian Presidency, the Committee considers that the adoption of a Directive of the scale and potential impact of the Consumer Credit Directive, requires a prior evaluation of its possible effect, given the commitments made by all the Institutions to better regulation. For this reason the Committee welcomed your statement that a broad economic analysis is both "necessary and justified".

Commissioner Kyprianou informed the IMCO Committee on 30 May 2006 that the Commission does not intend to carry out an Impact assessment as such, given the particular history of the dossier and the difficulties of defining which version of the constantly evolving proposal should be assessed.

The IMCO Committee has accordingly mandated me to inform you of its decision of 12 July 2006 to commission, using budget appropriations available to Parliament, a broad economic analysis of the impact of a Consumer Credit Directive.

The completed study will be transmitted to you for your consideration in the context of the ongoing work in Council.
