We refer to your request for access to European Commission documents registered on 14 November 2022 under the above-mentioned reference number.

You have requested 'all documentation (including but not limited to all email correspondence, attendance lists, agendas, background papers, transcripts, recordings and minutes/notes) relating to the meetings listed below:

- 1. Between Verband der Chemischen Industrie e.V (VCI) and Carsten Schierenbeck, Cabinet member of Maroš Šefčovič on 29/04/2022
- 2. Between European Chemical Industry Council (Cefic) and Kurt Vandenberghe, Cabinet member of Ursula von der Leyen on 01/12/2021.'

We have identified the following documents as falling in the remit of your application:

- 1) Email exchange between VCI and Carsten Schierenbeck (1), ref. ARES(2022)7489949;
- 2) Email exchange between VCI and Carsten Schierenbeck (2) and attachment, ref. ARES(2022)7490169;
- 3) Email exchange between Cefic and Kurt Vandenberghe, ref. ARES(5919566);
- 4) Minutes of the meeting of 1 December 2021, ref. ARES(2022)7670511.

With regard to the documents listed above, a complete disclosure of the identified documents is prevented by the exception concerning the protection of privacy and the integrity of the individual outlined in Article 4(1)(b) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, because they contain the following personal data:

- the names/initials and contact information of Commission staff members not pertaining to the senior management;
- the names/initials and contact details of other natural persons;
- other information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person (health related data).

Transfers of personal data from the Commission to countries that are not members of the European Economic Area, or to international organisations are regulated under Chapter V of the Data Protection Regulation<sup>1</sup>.

According to Article 47(1) of this Regulation, a transfer of personal data to a third country or an international organisation may take place where the Commission has decided that the third country, a territory or one or more specified sectors within that country, or the international organisation in question ensures an adequate level of protection and where the personal data are transferred solely to allow tasks within the competence of the controller to be carried out.

Based on the information available, the country of your residence is recognised by the Commission as ensuring an adequate level of protection. However, we would further like to inform you that Article 9(1)(b) of the Data Protection Regulation does not allow the transmission of these personal data, except if you prove that it is necessary to have the data transmitted to you for a specific purpose in the public interest and where there is no reason to assume that the legitimate interests of the data subject might be prejudiced. In your request, you do not express any particular interest to have access to these personal data nor do you put forward any arguments to establish the necessity to have the data transmitted for a specific purpose in the public interest.

Consequently, I conclude that, pursuant to Article 4(1)(b) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, access cannot be granted to the personal data contained in the requested documents, as the need to obtain access thereto for a purpose in the public interest has not been substantiated and there is no reason to think that the legitimate interests of the individuals concerned would not be prejudiced by disclosure of the personal data concerned.

Documents 1), 2) and 3) originate from third parties. Please note that documents originating from third parties are disclosed to you based on Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001. However, this disclosure is without prejudice to the rules on intellectual property, which may limit your right to reproduce or exploit the released documents without the agreement of the originator, who may hold an intellectual property right on them. The European Commission does not assume any responsibility from their reuse.

As for document 4), you may reuse the document disclosed free of charge and for non-commercial and commercial purposes provided that the source is acknowledged and that you do not distort the original meaning or message of the document. Please note that the Commission does not assume liability stemming from the reuse.

In case you would disagree with this position, you are entitled, in accordance with Article 7(2) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, to submit a confirmatory application requesting the Commission to review this position.

Such a confirmatory application should be addressed to the Secretariat-General of the Commission within 15 working days upon receipt of this letter. You can submit it in one of the following ways:
