Subject: Your request for access to documents - 2014/110

Thank you for your request dated 28 August 2014, which was registered in the EEAS access to documents registry under reference 2014/110, for access to documents under Regulation 1049/2001 regarding public access to European Parliament, Council and Commission documents ("the Regulation"), applicable to the EEAS pursuant to Article 11(1) of Council Decision 2010/427 of 26 July 2010 establishing the organization and functioning of the EEAS.

We understand from your request that you would like access to the following documents:

"All invitations, correspondence, briefings, de-briefings, background documents the EEAS holds related to the Round Table, organised jointly by Claude Moraes MEP and Lumos at the premises of the European Parliament on 8 April 2014. Also I request disclosure of any documents, correspondence etc related to any follow up to that meeting."

After consultation with the originator of the documents and the responsible division we can give you access to the following documents: invitations, agenda, correspondence, background document, report and minutes related to the Round Table, organised jointly by Claude Moraes MEP and Lumos.

Please note that some personal data cannot be disclosed and were expunged from the documents. Their disclosure could therefore be contrary to the data subjects' right for privacy pursuant to art 4.1,b of the Regulation.

I must also remind you that the documents may not be copied or reproduced for commercial purposes without prior consultation with the EEAS.

Should you wish this position to be reviewed you may write to the EEAS at the address below, confirming your initial request. You have fifteen working days in which to do so from receipt of this letter, after which your initial request will be deemed to have been satisfied.

The EEAS would inform you of the result of this review within fifteen working days from the registration of your request, either granting you access to the documents or confirming the refusal. In the latter case, you would be informed of how you can take further action.


