Subject: Your request for access to documents - 2015/100

Thank you for your request for access to documents dated 19 May, 2015, registered the same day in our access to documents register under the reference 2015/100.

We have examined your request in the framework of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council regarding public access to European Parliament, Council and Commission documents (hereafter the "Regulation"), which is applicable to the EEAS pursuant to Article 11(1) of Council Decision 2010/427/UE of 26 July 2010 establishing the organisation and functioning of the European External Action Service.

We understand that you request public access to any documents, including emailed correspondences held by the EU mission in Indonesia or the EEAS, pertaining to Aceh province's new spatial plan, which was passed by the provincial government in December 2013.

After consultation with the EU Delegation in Indonesia and the responsible division we can give you access to all documents identified by EU Delegation.

Please note that some personal data cannot be disclosed and were expunged from the documents. Their disclosure could therefore be contrary to the data subjects' right for privacy pursuant to art 4(1)b of the Regulation.


I must also remind you that the documents may not be copied or reproduced for commercial purposes without prior consultation with the EEAS.

Should you wish this position to be reviewed you may write to the EEAS at the address below, confirming your initial request. You have fifteen working days in which to do so from receipt of this letter, after which your initial request will be deemed to have been satisfied.

The EEAS would inform you of the result of this review within fifteen working days from the registration of your request, either granting you access to the documents or confirming the refusal. In the latter case, you would be informed of how you can take further action.
