**Subject: Your application for access to documents - Ref GestDem No 2016 - 709**

I refer to your e-mail dated 12/02/2016 and registered under the above mentioned reference number.

In your e-mail you make the following request for access to documents:

*"...all communication, including emails, and documents (agendas, minutes, list of participants, etc) related to the bilateral US-EU workshop on endocrine disruptors (also spelled: disruptors) which took place October 6th and 7th 2015".*

You will find a list of the identified documents in the annex to this letter.

You may reuse the documents, which originate from the Commission, free of charge for non-commercial and commercial purposes provided that the source is acknowledged, that you do not distort the original meaning or message of the documents. Please note that the Commission does not assume liability stemming from the reuse.

One of the documents originates from a third party whose agreement for disclosure DG Environment has not received within the requested deadline. Thus it is not disclosed due to the copyright possessed by the authors (Article 4(2), 1<sup>st</sup> indent of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001).

The other documents that originate from third parties and for which we received an agreement for disclosure, are disclosed for information only and cannot be re-used without the agreement of the originators, who hold a copyright on them. They do not reflect the position of the Commission and cannot be quoted as such.

In addition, some of the documents to which you have requested access, contain personal data which was blanked out following the justification provided below.

Pursuant to Article 4(1) (b) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, access to a document has to be refused if its disclosure would undermine the protection of privacy and the integrity of the individual, in particular in accordance with Community legislation regarding the protection of personal data. The applicable legislation in this field is Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 18 December 2000 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data by the Community institutions and bodies and on the free movement of such data<sup>1</sup>.

When access is requested to documents containing personal data, Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 becomes fully applicable<sup>2</sup>. According to Article 8(b) of this Regulation, personal data shall only be transferred to recipients if they establish the necessity of having the data transferred to them and if there is no reason to assume that the legitimate rights of the persons concerned might be prejudiced.

We consider that, with the information available, the necessity of disclosing the aforementioned personal data to you has not been established and that it cannot be assumed that such disclosure would not prejudice the legitimate rights of the persons concerned. Therefore, we are disclosing the documents requested expunged from this personal data.

If you wish to receive these personal data, we invite you to provide us with arguments showing the need for having these personal data transferred to you and the absence of adverse effects to the legitimate rights of the persons whose personal data should be disclosed.

In case you would disagree with the assessment that the expunged data are personal data which can only be disclosed if such disclosure is legitimate under the rules of personal data protection, you are entitled, in accordance with Article 7(2) of Regulation 1049/2001, to make a confirmatory application requesting the Commission to review this position.
