Dear Daniel.

It was a pleasure to see you well installed in your new Directorate General after only one month. Your clear enthusiasm about your new challenge is most encouraging and I wish you every success at a time which is critical for Europe and for its industries.

The agenda you sketched out at our meeting included President Junker's flagship proposal on the Circular Economy. We look forward to being an active player in the process of helping the EU and the Commission in particular to develop a Circular Economy strategy which is ambitious but grounded in solid industrial experience. As we discussed, creating an environment where innovation is encouraged and rewarded will be critical to the success of this ambitious objective. As I said in the meeting, we at ExxonMobil have a considerable track record on innovation. We spend about \$1 billion annually on research and have over our history pioneered advanced technology which has led to better products, higher efficiency or lower environmental impact across our key sectors of oil and gas, refining and chemicals manufacturing.

As we have discussed, we remain vigilant on assessing the safety and environmental impacts of the products we make and sell through our independent laboratory, ExxonMobil Biomedical Sciences Inc. For example, our High Molecular Weight (HMW) Phthalates were introduced some time ago, and eventually replaced older LMW products due to their more favourable safety profile and higher performance in many end use applications. Our experience in researching and developing safer products based on testing and data leads us to be wary of quick solutions involving the substitution of well-known products by untested replacements. There is a balance to be struck but the bottom line for ExxonMobil is always rigorous, proven safety. This will be a key point as the discussion on what a "Toxic-free Strategy" means in reality, and I very much welcome your aim of achieving positive outcomes for industry and society.

I was also pleased to have the opportunity to touch on our experience of REACH over the past few years. We have supported REACH as at the heart of the regulation is an understanding that chemicals are beneficial and that the risks posed by their use, can be effectively managed. We have discussed the example of the HMW phthalate plasticizer DINP on several occasions, which as you know, has been evaluated for 15 of the last 20 years and has been repeatedly found safe not only by the EU but also by countries around the world. This outcome was again upheld by ECHA only last year but once again DINP is under threat of a further assessment contemplated by Denmark. I fully understand that every Member State has the right under the Regulation to put forward substances for assessment, but the recurrent exercise of that right to invoke repeated evaluations of the same substance simply puts a brake on investment and innovation. In our meeting, a view was expressed that industry needs to "accept the regulatory fate" of decisions reached by ECHA under REACH. I think it is equally important that other stakeholders, including member states, are held to the same standard and accept safe outcomes for substances which have been rigorously evaluated.

Your offer to consider how the application of chemicals regulation can be streamlined and made more transparent is welcome and I understand that you intend to discuss the matter with Geert Dancet. I think the REFIT and Review processes provide us all with an opportunity to ensure that businesses like our own can play a constructive role and work closely with you and your colleagues to provide EU citizens with more economic security, health and environmental protection and a better quality of life.

I look forward to continuing our conversation and being involved in the important projects ahead
