Dear Ms Cann,

We refer to your e-mail dated 30 November 2016 and registered on the same day under the above-mentioned reference number.

In your e-mail, you request "... copies of applications by Commissioner Georgieva which seek Commission authorisation for new professional activities. I would further like to request any emails, correspondence and meeting notes which relate to this application; all opinions from the ad hoc ethical committee; and copies of the Commission's final decision (C(2016) 7196)."

I have identified 5 documents falling within the scope of your request:

- 5. Letter of Mr Italianer to Vice-President Georgieva of 11.09.2016 [Ref. Ares(2016)6345478];

which the decision on Vice-President Georgieva envisaged post-mandate activity was adopted. Please note that the minutes are already available to the public and therefore, a copy is not enclosed.

2. CONCLUSIONS UNDER REGULATION 1049/2001

Following the examination of your request and of the documents concerned, I am pleased to grant you:

- full access to documents n° 1, 3 and 5. You will find copies enclosed.
- partial access to the e-mails under document n° 2 and to the annexed draft decisions. You will find copies enclosed.

The reasons for the refusal of the deleted parts of the above-mentioned documents are set out below.

The deleted parts of the e-mails contain the names and the e-mail addresses of the Commission's officials in charge of the file. This is personal data covered by the exception provided for in Article 4 (1) (b) of Regulation 1049/2001. Disclosing this information would undermine the privacy of the Commission officials concerned.

In its judgment in the *Bavarian Lager* case¹, the Court of Justice ruled that when a request is made for access to documents containing personal data, Regulation (EC) No. $45/2001^2$ (hereinafter the 'Data Protection Regulation') becomes fully applicable.

The concerned documents contain elements which undoubtedly constitute personal data in the meaning of Article 2(a) of Regulation (EC) No 45/2001, as they reveal information about an identified or an identifiable person. According to Article 8(b) of the Data Protection Regulation, which is fully applicable in this case, personal data shall only be transferred to recipients if the recipient establishes the necessity of having the data transferred and if there is no reason to assume that the data subject's legitimate interests might be prejudiced.³ Those two conditions are cumulative.⁴

I consider that in the present case the necessity of disclosing the aforementioned personal data to you has not been established in your request.

Consequently, access to personal data contained in the relevant parts of the above-mentioned e-mails has to be refused on the basis of the exception provided for in Article 4 (1) (b) of Regulation 1049/2001.

If you wish to appeal against this decision, you should write to the Commission Secretary-General at the address <u>sg-acc-doc@ec.europa.eu</u>. You have fifteen working days from receipt of this letter in which to appeal.
