Dear Commissioner,

Following our short discussion about Coca-Cola in the EU during your visit to AmCham EU a few months ago, I allow myself to contact you in regard recent allegations against Coca-Cola in Germany in the field of packaging & packaging waste.

In an open letter to you by the European Environmental Bureau and other NGOs, Coca-Cola is being criticized for shift[ing] away from environmentally-friendly and waste-preventing reusable systems.

Please let me clarify that these allegations are not true. Coca-Cola is committed to sustainable packaging and will continue to use refillable bottles in Germany and many other European markets.

Indeed our German bottler Coca-Cola Erfrischungsgetr nke AG has taken the decision to phase out two types of packaging from its broad range of refillable bottles as those have proven to be economically unsustainable. However, these two packaging types constitute only a small part of our refillables portfolio, and our share of refillable packaging in Germany will continue to be substantially higher than the industry average. There are no plans to change this.

Refillable packaging will continue to be an integral part of our company s sustainable packaging policy in Germany, in addition to the many other types of containers we use, made from glass, metal, PET and carton, all being 100% recyclable.

Please find attached a background document on the matter with further information. I'm at your disposal at any time should you have questions or wish to discuss this matter in more detail.

## **Coca-Cola Germany Supports Variety of Beverage Packages**

Coca-Cola in Germany, which has a variety of refillable and recyclable beverage packages, is discontinuing two of its refillable PET packaging sizes, which has led to some questions about the environmental impact of the decision.

Coca-Cola Erfrischungsgetränke AG, the Coca-Cola bottler in Germany, is committed to providing a comprehensive range of the highest quality products to meet consumer needs while at the same time minimizing our impact on the environment. The German bottler offers products in a range of refillable bottles in both glass and PET, as well as recyclable PET plastic bottles. In fact, over the years, Coca-Cola in Germany has introduced a choice of eight different refillable packages (from 0.2l glass bottle through to 1.5l refillable PET<sup>1</sup>).

Last year, Coca-Cola Erfrischungsgetränke AG announced that due to changes in consumer purchasing habits and to improve efficiencies it would no longer produce the 0.5I and 1.5I refillable PET bottles.

Even with this change, the system's refillable share of packaging in Germany will remain above the average of the overall German soft drinks industry. Coca-Cola Erfrischungsgetränke AG remains committed to offering a packaging mix, whether in glass or PET, refillable or non-refillable.

It will continue to offer 0.5I and 1.5I packs for German consumers in PET. This pack also has a second life with about 95% of Coca-Cola non-refillable PET packaging in Germany being collected and recycled into new products. Coca-Cola Germany also currently uses an average of 25% recycled material in its non-refillable PET bottles.

The Coca-Cola Company believes it can always do more and continues to work on packaging innovations. With the launch of Coca-Cola Life in Germany, it will introduce for the first time, worldwide, a bottle which is made exclusively of recycled PET. This 100% rPET bottle is produced in a resource-saving manner from recycled bottles. New material is not necessary, so that CO<sub>2</sub> emissions and natural resources can be saved.

Dear \_\_\_\_\_\_

It was a pleasure to talk to you the the Fleishman Hillard event last Wednesday. I would like to take the opportunity to come back to your offer to industry to give input for the best possible framework for a circular economy and the upcoming roadmap on plastics. Our company has been engaged in driving circular economy for a long time not just to make all our packages including their components (e.g. labels and closures) recyclable, but also to use recycled materials. So we presented the first beverage plastic bottle containing recycled content already in 1991 and our first bottle containing bio-based plastics in 2009. We have both package systems in the market as well as we are reusing some of our packages. In Germany we have the first pilot plant recycling 99.4% of all production waste (material recycling – stoffliche Verwertung – only).

But we also know the challenges to drive solutions like reuse, recycling content, bio-based material but also biodegradables, deposit systems, water efficiency and water reuse. I personally have experienced all of these challenges with the German packaging regulation and the Green Dot systems here, as I was involved in the development and implementation from the beginning in 1990.

I would like to ask you for a personal exchange in the next weeks on these experiences and challenges related to the current proposal and political discussion (including several amendments in the EP) of the Waste Framework Directive, the Packaging and Packaging Waste Directive and the Plastic Strategy. I am looking forward for your feedback and possible dates for a meeting.


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
