Subject: Your request for access to documents of 16 January 2018


On behalf of CEPOL, the EU agency responsible for the training of law enforcement officers across Europe, I would like to extend my sincerest regards to you and your colleagues at Access Info Europe.

We understand that you submitted a request under Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council regarding public access to documents¹, regarding documents that detail the travel expenses that occurred in the period 01 January 2016-31 December 2016 in relation to missions undertaken by the Executive Director of CEPOL.
