Overall, MS stressed that the package was still being examined, and that this process was likely to take some time, as a number of authorities were involved. The package as such was generally welcomed. Preliminary comments concentrated on the proposal for a Directive,

Concerning the proposed **Directive on access to justice**, the main comments related to: - the need to look more in detail at the question of Community competence under the first pillar (as opposed to possible action under the third pillar, ES, FIN, PT); - the question of subsidiarity (F, who overall was rather positive, D, NL, SW), - the question of the added value of the Directive as compared to already existing national régimes (UK, PT), - alleging that the proposal goes beyond the requirements of the Århus Convention (FIN, PT, DK, AU, D), - the scope (F, D, in relation to including actions of private persons); - the relation with more progressive national legislation (UK, in particular relating to those admitted to go to the Courts); - the relation with other Directives (AU, GR). PT requested the studies of comparative law to be made available for scrutiny as soon as possible.
