> Incident with Spanish NGO Proactive Open Arms

- After the Spanish NGO Proactiva Open Arms vessel was seized by IT authorities, Médecin sans Frontiers (MSF) stated that Aquarius, jointly operated by SOS Méditerranée and MSF, is now the only Search and Rescue NGO vessel operating in the Central Med area. MSF sent a letter to DDG Mordue expressing some concerns about the current SAR practice in Central Med, involvement of the Libyan Coast Guard and disembarkation of migrants in Libya. A draft reply is currently under preparation jointly by C1 and C2. A meeting was organised last Friday between DDG Mordue and three representatives of MSF to address these issues (flash circulated). DDG Mordue also met Proactiva Open Arms and had a frank and cordial meeting. Open Arms was particularly concerned about the criminal procedure in Italy and economic consequences as well the impact on their SAR operations in the Mediterranean.
