NESTE considered that there is a high level of commitment to these negotiations among Indonesian stakeholders and asked about discussions on palm oil in that context, stressing in particular that the FTA could support the ongoing efforts to strengthen the sustainability of palm oil production in Indonesia. NESTE is closely following developments on the Indonesian Sustainable Palm Oil scheme and would be interested to provide further information in this respect to the Commission.

Mr Velasco Martins noted that palm oil is an important product in the negotiations and discussions are ongoing on how to best address it in a realistic and effective manner.
