Ahead of tomorrow's Trialogue meeting, please find below the opinion article "<u>Gender-based violence</u> <u>and mining-fuelled conflict</u>" published by our partner Thérèse Mema Mapenzi, from the Justice and Peace Commission in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC). Her article gives a specific insight to gender based violence linked to natural resource extraction in Eastern DRC.

As a reminder, we recommend that EU Member States revisit their positions and:

- 1. Show leadership by supporting mandatory due diligence requirements along the entire supply chain (including Downstream).
- 2. Support a Regulation that aligns with the OECD Due Diligence Guidance on Conflict Minerals, by:
- Ensuring that all due diligence obligations are consistent with the OECD standards
- <u>Engaging companies downstream</u> of metal importers, in particular companies that place products containing covered minerals on the EU market
- Including language that reflects the flexible and progressive nature of due diligence.
