Dear Mr Evans,

We refer to your application of 27/03/2019, registered on 28/03/2019 under the above mentioned reference number, by which you made a request pursuant to Regulation No 1049/2001 regarding public access to European Parliament, Council and Commission documents¹.

You requested:

"Any communications with any relevant UK bodies detailing the implications that exiting the European Union would have on data protection."

Any communication with technology companies regarding data security after the UK leaves the EU."

In relation to data protection, on 21 September 2017 the European Commission sent to the UK government the EU Position paper on the use of data and protection of information obtained or processed before the withdrawal date.²

On 5 December 2018, both sides published the final Withdrawal Agreement³. Title VII provides the legal basis for processing of data obtained before the end of the transition period.

The Political declaration setting out the framework for the future relationship between the EU and the UK⁴, published on 22 November 2018, reflects common understanding for the future cooperation, *inter alia*, in the area of data exchange and data protection.

In the framework of preparations for a 'no deal' scenario, the European Commission on 9 January 2018 published a preparedness notice about legal repercussions in the area of data protection in case of the UK's withdrawal from the EU without an agreement.⁵

In addition, the European Commission on 10 April 2019 issued **practical guidelines**⁶ to ensure coordinated EU approach in a 'no deal' scenario, including in the area of data protection.

In accordance with Article 7(2) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, you are entitled to make a confirmatory application requesting the Commission to review this position.

Such a confirmatory application should be addressed within 15 working days upon receipt of this letter to the Secretariat-General of the Commission at the following address:
