Description and justification:

The full financing of the action has been already agreed and approved at the level of the corresponding Action Document to which this contract belongs (T05-EUTF-NOA-LY 08) Ares (2019) 4564900 10th July 2019: “Managing mixed migration flows (top up): Enhancing protection and assistance for those in need in Libya”.

As established in PRAG 6.3.9, financing in full has been considered necessary to be able to carry out the action, which entails assistance for displaced people and people of concern in a crisis (Libya). The action mainly aims to protect health and fundamental rights of people in a crisis. As explained below, the partner has no capacity to raise additional funds for co-financing due to the current situation in Libya.

The action scales up the past three years of CESVI and IMC interventions in Libya and builds on the experience of the projects funded by EIDHR (NEAR-TS/2018/391-272) and EUTF (T05.2.NOA). It constitutes an expansion of these past projects. Given the high instability and fluidity of the context, it is crucial for CESVI and for the EUTF to maintain a certain degree of flexibility in the operational planning in order to provide a more effective and timely assistance to respond to emergencies and huge population flows in both detention centers and urban settings.

At the same time, it is key to be able to adapt operations according to the dynamic and shifting political and social context, as well as the fragmentation of the actors and the communities in Libya. These factors, in addition to the nature of the project, the amount requested and the context of the location targeted, including intervention inside detention centers, make it impossible to find any co-funding opportunity.

Because of the continued exceptional circumstances in Libya, extension of acknowledgment of crisis situation was granted on 27th June 2019 (Ares(2019)408575), which entails the continuation of the applicability of flexible procedures in all programs implemented in Libya (from 01/07/2019 to 30/06/2020).
