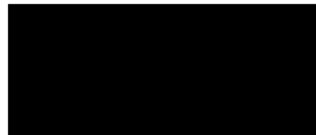

As you are aware, the proposal on CBAM will be a key element in the "Fit-for-55-package" in July.

From the recent leak it is also clear that the EC is considering fertilizers to be one of the first sectors to join the CBAM.

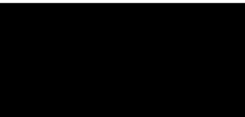
We have made three clear conditions for this to take place:

1. A combination of CBAM and free allowances is absolutely for reasons of international competitiveness
2. Not only basic products but also finished fertilizers should be included to prevent circumvention
3. A carbon export mechanism must be included so fertilizers continue to be competitive on the world market

I find the present state of discussion where the EC hides behind naturally conservative WTO-lawyers to see CBAM and free allowances as alternative, when a combination is so obviously the right solution. The EU has very high climate ambitions. It should have equally high ambitions and courage to bring this policy to WTO.

In light of this, I would appreciate if we could arrange a meeting to explain our position in more detail.
