Dear Ms Voller, Dear Ms Obbekær,

I hereby acknowledge receipt of your e-mail of 3 December 2021, by means of which you requested access to "documents which contain the following information: EU countries that have requested to use chlorpryrifos and/or chlorpyrifos-methyl for a period not exceeding 120 days and for limited and controlled use because an emergency situation has occurred". You highlight that you are "interested in data for 2020 and 2021".

Your PAD application has been registered as PAD 2021/173 and processed in accordance with Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001. We would like to provide you with a reply as follows.

Please be informed that emergency authorisations are granted by the EU Member States (MS) which are required to communicate such authorisations to the European Commission and other Member States in accordance with Article 53 of Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009, providing detailed information about the situation and any measures taken to ensure consumer safety. EFSA can be mandated by the European Commission in accordance with Article 53(2) of Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009 to revise the assessments prepared by the EU MS when granting the emergency authorisations. As concerns chlorpyrifos and chlorpyrifos-methyl, please be informed that EFSA did not receive a mandate from the European Commission in accordance with Article 53(2) of Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009.

Therefore, having duly considered your PAD application and having conducted the requisite internal verifications, we regret to inform you that EFSA is not in possession of the requested documents. Please note that, as confirmed by the settled case law of the Court of Justice of the European Union<sup>1</sup>, a presumption of veracity shall be applicable in situations whereby an EU institution, body, office or agency declares that it is not in possession of documents requested by way of the medium of public access to documents.
