Dear Ms Scholz,

Thank you for your request for access to documents of the Council of the European Union..1

You are requesting "documents which contain information regarding the Council's current public communication strategy" and more specifically "documents, which specify who the Council's Directorate-General Communication and Information and other (for example, personal) communication staff or advisers are talking to, why they are talking to them, how and when they will talk to them, what form of communication the content takes and what channels they use to share it".

The main basis for interaction of staff of the General Secretariat of the Council (thus including staff of its Directorate General for Communication and Information) is the Code of Good Administrative Behaviour, which you will find published at the following address:

Pursuant to Article 10 of this Code, the Press Office is responsible for contacts with the media, but when requests for information from media concern technical subjects falling within their specific areas of responsibility, other members of staff may answer them.

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The General Secretariat of the Council has examined your request on the basis of the applicable rules: Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council regarding public access to European Parliament, Council and Commission documents (OJ L 145, 31.5.2001, p. 43) and the specific provisions concerning public access to Council documents set out in Annex II to the Council's Rules of Procedure (Council Decision No 2009/937/EU, OJ L 325, 11.12.2009, p. 35).

The principles of this Code have been translated into internal guidelines, and you will find the ones currently applied enclosed (file name: Press and audiovisual.pdf), as taken from the intranet site of the General Secretariat.

Please refer to Articles 4 to 9 of the Code for general interaction with the public at large and specifically when providing information, replying to letters and telephone calls.

Concerning staff notes 83/11 and 4/19, please note that access to some parts has to be withheld for the following reasons:

Staff note 83/11 contains personal data about identified persons. The personal data contained in this document is necessary for the organisation of the work of the Council.

EU data protection rules² provide that when the personal data collected is to be used for a different purpose, including disclosure to the public, a balance needs to be established between the public interest in having access to such data and the legitimate right of individuals to protect their personal data.³

After carefully considering all the principles related to this request, on balance the General Secretariat has concluded that disclosure of the personal data contained in the document would undermine the protection of privacy and the integrity of the identified individuals. Therefore, the General Secretariat has to refuse access to this data.⁴

Staff note 4/19 contains functional email addresses and hyperlinks for internal purposes. Release of these addresses and links would affect the security of IT systems.

Full disclosure of the document would therefore undermine the protection of the public interest as regards public security. As a consequence, the General Secretariat has to refuse access to these addresses and links.⁵

Pursuant to Article 7(2) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, you may ask the Council to review this decision within 15 working days of receiving this reply. Should you see the need for such a review, you are invited to indicate the reasons thereof.
