Dear Mr Henning,

We refer to your request for access to European Commission documents, registered under the above-mentioned reference number.

You request access to "all minutes, agendas, summaries, notes or memos issued before or after; documents prepared for, issued in preparation for, or exchanged during; as well as all correspondence including attachments by either of the meeting parties related to" a number of meetings of the members of the Cabinet of EVP Vestager.

Please note that due to the wide scope of your request, covering also areas falling under the responsibility of other Directorates-General, parts of your request have been attributed to the Secretariat-General <sup>2</sup>. This reply relates only to the documents held by Directorate-General for Competition. I understand that you already received the reply from the Secretariat-General.

First, the following two documents, related to the 12.12.2022 meeting between Penelope Papandropoulos and CMA CGM, fall within the scope of your application:

- Ares(2022)8074043 Meeting request CMA CGM & Hill+Knowlton Strategies on CBER
- Ares(2022)8728295 Minutes of CAB meeting with CMA-CGM, 12.12.2022

Having examined the above two documents requested under the provisions of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 regarding public access to documents, I have come to the conclusion that both documents may be partially disclosed. Some parts of the documents have been blanked out as they contain personal data and their disclosure is prevented by the exception to the right of access laid down in Article 4(1)(b).

Second, the following two documents, related to the 12.12.2022 meeting between Penelope Papandropoulos and CMA CGM, also fall within the scope of your application:

- The economic study commissioned by CMA-CGM in the context of the evaluation of the Consortia Block Exemption Regulation (CBER)
- The briefing that was prepared by the Directorate-General for Competition (DG COMP) for the meeting between Penelope Papandropoulos and CMA CGM

Having examined the above two documents requested under the provisions of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 regarding public access to documents, I regret to inform you that your application cannot be granted, as disclosure is prevented by exceptions to the right of access laid down in Article 4 of this Regulation.

Disclosure of the requested economic study would undermine the protection of the commercial interests of the company that submitted it, as putting this information in the public domain would affect its competitive position on the market. More specifically, the economic study is based on CMA-CGM business data, and its public disclosure would cause direct prejudice to the latter by revealing commercially sensitive information to its competitors. Moreover, the disclosure of the study would breach CMA-CGM intellectual property rights in relation to the study by allowing third parties to use the study without the proper arrangements for the protection of those rights. Therefore, the exception laid down in Article 4(2) first indent of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 applies to this document.

Disclosure of the briefing would undermine the protection of the decision-making process of the Commission in relation to the possible Commission's actions following the evaluation of the CBER, namely whether to prolong the CBER (with or without amendments), or to let the CBER expire. It would reveal preliminary views and policy options which are currently under consideration. The Commission's services must be free to explore all possible options in preparation of a decision free from external pressure. Therefore, the exception laid down in Article 4(3) first subparagraph of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 applies to this document.

The exceptions laid down in Article 4(2) and 4(3) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 apply unless there is an overriding public interest in disclosure of the documents. I have not been able to identify such an overriding public interest in this case. Similarly, your request does not refer to an overriding public interest.
