Issues raised & follow-up	The meeting was held at the request of Vattenfall that expressed concerns regarding the position of the European Parliament in the on-going negotiations of the Renewable Energy Directive regarding the use of forest biomass to produce energy.
	Vattenfall operates district heating and cooling grids in Sweden, Germany (Berlin, where coal is to be phased out by 2030) and The Netherlands. It is committed to reach net-zero emissions by 2040, and plans to replace fossil fuels with alternatives such as third-party excess heat integration, renewable-based power-to-heat, geothermal and green hydrogen, but also by increasing the use of biomass until zero–emission alternatives are available at sufficient scale.
	It is therefore concerned with the EP proposals to cap the contribution of primary woody biomass to the EU renewable energy target at 2017-2022 consumption levels and to remove financial support to the energy use of that feedstock. Vattenfall described the constraints associated with using any of the above-mentioned other energy sources (timing of deployment, ability to provide baseload) and stressed the need to be able to provide heating at an affordable price. The Commission explained its understanding of the objective pursued by the European Parliament and took note of the concerns voiced by Vattenfall.
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
