Subject: Your application for access to documents –2023/2860

I refer to your email of 12 May 2022 in which you made a request for access to documents, registered on 12 May 2022 under the case number 2023/2860. Your request was passed to the Secretariat General for handling, in view of its subject matter.

In your request you ask for access to “all minutes, agendas, summaries, notes or memos issued before or after; documents prepared for, issued in preparation for, or exchanged during; as well as all correspondence including attachments by either of the meeting parties related to the 17.02.2020 between The App Association and Werner Stengg”.

Your application therefore concerns the following documents:

1. Ares(2020)507151 email_Redacted;
2. Ares(2020)517494 Meeting request ACT App associaiton_Redacted
3. Ares(2023)4046263 2020-02-17 W Stengg meeting ACT - draft_Redacted;

A complete disclosure of these documents is prevented by the exception concerning the protection of privacy and the integrity of the individual outlined in Article 4(1)(b) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, because they contain the following personal data:

- the names/initials and contact information of Commission staff members not pertaining to the senior management; or
- the names/initials and contact details of natural persons.

Article 9(1)(b) of the Data Protection Regulation (Regulation 2018/1725) does not allow the transmission of these personal data, except if you prove that it is necessary to have the data transmitted to you for a specific purpose in the public interest and where there is no reason to assume that the legitimate interests of the data subject might be prejudiced. In your request, you do neither express any particular interest to have access to these

personal data, nor put forward arguments to establish the necessity to have the data transmitted for a specific purpose in the public interest.

Consequently, I conclude that, pursuant to Article 4(1)(b) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, access cannot be granted to the personal data contained in the requested documents, as the need to obtain access thereto for a purpose in the public interest has not been substantiated and there is no reason to think that the legitimate interests of the individuals concerned would not be prejudiced by disclosure of the personal data concerned.

Please also note that notes of meetings are drawn up for internal use under the responsibility of the relevant services of the European Commission. They solely reflect the author's interpretation of the interventions made and do not set out any official position of the third parties to which the document refers. They do not reflect the position of the Commission and cannot be quoted as such.

In case you would disagree with this position, you are entitled, in accordance with Article 7(2) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, to submit a confirmatory application requesting the Commission to review this position.

Such a confirmatory application should be addressed to the Secretariat-General of the Commission within 15 working days upon receipt of this letter. You can submit it in one of the following ways:
