**Subject: Your confirmatory application for access to documents under
Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 - GESTDEM 2015/3233**

Dear Mr Dohle,

I refer to your letter, registered on 27 August 2015, through which you submit a confirmatory application in accordance with Article 7(2) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 regarding public access to European Parliament, Council and Commission documents¹ ("Regulation 1049/2001").

Your initial request, dealt by the Commission's Directorate-General for Justice and Consumers (DG JUST), concerns the following documents:

All documents (agenda, minutes, internal correspondence) on the inter-service group on the right of the child, as established in the Communication from the Commission towards an EU strategy on the Rights of the Child of 2006.

On 8 July 2015, DG JUST sent you a positive reply granting wide partial access – subject to redaction of personal data only – to documents covering years 2006-2010. DG JUST informed you that in September 2015 it will send you the second part of the reply assessing documents from 2011 to date.

The reason for your confirmatory application was the absence of the second part of the reply. In the meantime, DG JUST has informed us that on 21 September 2015 they sent you their reply providing you access to the remaining documents, from which only personal data was redacted.

In light of this reply from DG JUST and considering that you do not appear to contest the redactions of personal data made in the documents dispatched to you, I conclude that your confirmatory application has become devoid of purpose.
