Thank you for your letter of 08 June 2015 expressing your concern about alcohol and supporting the need for a new Alcohol Strategy.

First, I fully share your concern about alcohol misuse, which has devastating consequences that concern me as an individual, as a medical doctor and as European Commissioner.

I have taken full note of the European Parliament's Resolution of April calling for a new alcohol strategy, as well as recent discussions with Health Ministers at the Council, and the calls for reinforced EU action to address alcohol which I have received from organisations such as yours.

Second, I believe the European Commission needs to continue to work together with Member States and civil society, across a range of policy areas, to help tackle not only the consequences of alcohol misuse but, more importantly, the reasons which lead to such misuse.

The European Commission intends to find the best way to help Member States in reducing alcohol-related harm and addressing the reasons that lead to alcohol misuse – in the light of the recent discussions in the Parliament and in the Council. The Commission is currently examining all possible options for action to support national authorities in this regard. The Commission has not yet taken a decision concerning future EU action and the extent to which cooperation on alcohol could usefully be looked at in a wider context of tackling the key risk factors of chronic diseases.


