We refer to your e-mail dated 2/09/2016 in which you make a request for access to documents, registered on 2/09/2016 under the above mentioned reference number.

The Directorate-General for Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid Operations (ECHO) does not have any guidelines, operational procedures or a handbook in relation with your request as ECHO only applies the central instructions and guidelines by the Secretariat-General of the European Commission, who will reply to you separately.

Indeed, as specified in Article 2(3) of Regulation 1049/2001, the right of access as defined in that regulation applies only to existing documents in the possession of the institution.
