



ENTSOG System Development team has dedicated its efforts to best support the PCI process while TYNDP17 is still under development.

As part of actively supporting the identification of infrastructure needs by Regional Groups, ENTSOG has committed to provide the <u>TYNDP17</u> assessment of the infrastructure gap to Regional Groups already from mid-October, well ahead of the TYNDP publication.

As a first step in this, we held a Webinar yesterday dedicated to presenting these results to project promoters. We had a very good participation, with more than 45 participants.

The conclusions on the identified gaps are summarised at the end of the enclosed presentation:

- The conclusions are well aligned with the input provided by the NRAs to ACER.
- The first promoters' feedback shows a good consensus on the identified gaps.

I enclose for your information the full presentation we made in the Webinar.

Thanks for your email and apologies for not getting back to you earlier.

As you know we are currently working to complete TYNDP 2017, contributing to the PCI process, working on the interlinked model and on the joint ENTSOs scenario development process for TYNDP 2018. Our resource situation is extremely tense, especially as some of the tasks (early start of the PCI process, early start of the TYNDP18 scenario development process) were not in our plans.

In these conditions, we will actually not be able to dedicate proper time to the CBA study before mid-November. We can already consider timeslots after mid-November.

In view of the tasks we need to complete by end December, we may also need to consider shifting our work on the CBA update by 1-2 months.

On the timeline you proposed, some general comments:

- ACER requested in their Opinion on TYNDP15 that we publish draft TYNDP much earlier than our current timeline (to allow for public consultation and ACER opinion before final TYNDP by end of the year). It is a recommendation we would like to consider for TYNDP18, which could mean a publication in Q3-18, earlier than what you have in your current timeline
- Based on this, it seems there is some uncertainty if the updated CBA methodology could be ready on time to be applied to TYNDP18. On our side, it means we need to think how to handle this uncertainty.



To be honest, we definitely do not have a clear view on the CBA update topic on our side. Only thing I can say is before mid-November we will have almost no time to dedicate to the consultant, delivery of TYNDP17 being our n°1 priority. Sorry.

On further timeline, we would need to think more and re-discuss with you.

One of the things we need to sort is, looking at the process, would EC be ready to engage in an update process in 2017?


