Request for access to Frontex documents

Dear Mr Akkerman,

In reference to your application received on 14 March 2017 and specified later, in which you requested access to information on the state of play of cooperation with Egypt, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Libya, Mali, Mauritania, Morocco, Niger, Nigeria, Senegal, Somalia, Sudan and Tunisia, as well as any official correspondence that may be available and relevant Frontex reports, I am pleased to inform you that Frontex agrees to grant you access to the requested documents. You may find them attached.

Please note however that some limited parts of the documents you have requested fall under an exception to public access to documents as stipulated in Article 4 of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 of 30 May 2001. As a consequence, these parts of the documents have been blanked out.

In particular, the blanked out parts contain personal data, in particular the names, signatures and contact details of individuals. Their disclosure would affect the privacy and integrity of the individuals and is therefore precluded pursuant to the exception laid down in Article 4(1)(b) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001.

Finally, I would like to remind you that the copyright of the documents rests with Frontex and that the existing rules on copyright may limit your right to reproduce or exploit the released documents.
