Dear Mr Sabido,

We refer to your e-mail dated 31 March 2017 in which you make a request for access to documents, registered on 31 March 2017 under the above mentioned reference number.

In your application submitted under Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 regarding public access to documents, you request access to the following documents:

- "- a list of all meetings between DG Energy and other European Union bodies and/or third parties on the Paldiski LNG Terminal between January 2016 and 30 March 2017
- the minutes and all related documents of all meetings between DG Energy and other European Union bodies and/or third parties on the Paldiski LNG Terminal between January 2016 and 30 March 2017
- all correspondence (written, email) between DG Energy and other European Union bodies and/or third parties on the Paldiski LNG Terminal between January 2016 and 30 March 2017".

The documents which are subject to your application are listed in the annex to this letter.

Having examined the requested documents, I have come to the conclusion that they may be partially disclosed. Some parts of the documents have been blanked out as the third party with which the documents in question were exchanged has indicated that redacted parts of the documents contain commercially sensitive information of the company, are protected by

intellectual property rights, and/or relate to an ongoing court proceeding. According to Article 4(2) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, the Commission shall refuse access to a document where disclosure would undermine the protection of commercial interests of a natural or legal person, including intellectual property, and court proceedings and legal advice.

The exceptions laid down in Article 4(2) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 apply unless there is an overriding public interest in disclosure of the documents. I have examined whether there could be an overriding public interest in disclosure, but I have not been able to identify such an interest.

Regarding the meetings, I would like to refer you to the transparency register (http://ec.europa.eu/transparencyinitiative/meetings/meeting.do?host=61569260-525e-42f8-aa52-51d7bfc30d4f that is open to the public.

In accordance with Article 7(2) of Regulation 1049/2001, you are entitled to make a confirmatory application requesting the Commission to review this position.
