

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Disclosing this information publicly will undermine the effectiveness of Frontex operations as the risk analysis based on this information and used by Frontex to run its operations, would become common knowledge rather than intelligence to combat crime and prevent illegal cross-border activity. If this information would become public the efforts carried out by the European Union and Member States to curtail criminal activities would be jeopardized. Furthermore, there is a real

risk that disclosing this information contained therein would be of benefit for the smuggling networks who would change their modus operandi accordingly, thus putting the life of migrants in danger.

The disclosure is therefore

refused, as it would undermine the protection of the public interest as regards public security in the sense of Article 4(1)(a) of the Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 30 May 2001 regarding public access to European Parliament, Council and Commission documents.

Support debriefing activities by deploying Joint Debriefing Teams in order to collect information for risk analysis purposes




Provide with a clear and updated situational picture concerning the operational areas, modus operandi, main trends and possible rapid changes in this respect

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





EUROSUR FUSION SERVICES

The non-disclosed parts contain detailed information regarding the modus operandi of law enforcement officials when performing border control. Disclosing such information would expose the working methods applied in ongoing and future operations, thus obstructing them and the efforts made by the EU and its Member States to counter and prevent cross-border crime and unauthorized border crossings. If this were to happen, public security would be affected. In light of the above, the text is not disclosed pursuant to the exception laid down in the first indent of Article 4(1)(a) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 relating to the protection of the public interest as regards public security.

The non-disclosed text contain detailed information related to reporting tools and methods used by law enforcemen officials. The text contains references to the methods applied by law enforcement officers to perform border control tasks in general and to counter illegal activities in particular. Its publicity would expose the working methods applied

1. To support and add value to operational activities;

2.

- 3. All services provided are in line with the Frontex Regulation and the Eurosur Regulation.
- 4. A number of information services and data sources (external: institutional, commercial providers; internal: Frontex systems) are bundled together into customized and integrated services.
- 5. Services delivered to EU Member States authorities and other partners via different communication channels, including the Eurosur network.
- 6. Services defined and based on user needs in the Member States. Frontex shall contribute to achieve the strategic and operational objectives of border surveillance.
