Dear Mr Blackledge,

Thank you for your email dated 13 September 2019 received via the "asktheeu.org" portal, whereby you submitted a request for access to documents in accordance with Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, which is applicable to documents held by the European Union Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) under Art. 119(1) of Regulation (EU) No 2018/1139. You are requesting EASA to disclose documents that contain "the number of EASA Part 145 organisations there are in the EASA region".

To answer your request, I would first kindly like to point out that under the EU regulatory framework EASA is not the competent authority for the issuance and renewal of Part-145 (maintenance organisation) approvals located in EASA States. In accordance with Art. 145.1 of Annex II (Part-145) to Commission Regulation (EU) 1321/2014<sup>3</sup>, Part-145 approvals are issued by the competent authorities of the EU Member States, plus Switzerland, Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein. This said, based on Art. 5 of Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) No 628/2013<sup>4</sup>, the competent authorities provide EASA with the information relevant for performing activities related to safety oversight, which includes the number of Part-145 approvals issued by them.

Please find below an excerpt of the respective EASA database that shows the information you are interested in. You will see that based on the information provided to EASA by the competent authorities during the last data collection campaign in April 2019, a total of 1926 Part-145 approved organisation exists in the 32 EASA States.
