We refer to your application of 1 October 2019, registered on the same day under the above mentioned reference number, by which you made a request pursuant to Regulation No 1049/2001 regarding public access to European Parliament, Council and Commission documents¹.

You requested "documents which contain the following information: Any legal advice given by the European Commission to Philip Hammond or other British members of UK parliament with regards to the Benn Act - the law which prevents a no deal Brexit."
