Subject: Your request on access to documents

Dear Mr Schindler,

Thank you for your e-mail dated 8 June 2020, in which you apply for access to documents in accordance with Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001,¹ that is applicable to documents held by the European Union Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) under Art. 119(1) of Regulation (EU) No 2018/1139.²

You request “any information related to Palantir and its products and services, including: a) meeting records [...], b) correspondence [...], c) invoices, tenders, service, agreements, purchases, orders, procurement documents, offers etc. concerning products and services using Palantir Technologies”.

Kindly note that your actual application is very broad and relates to a large number of documents. Due to this wide-scope EASA would not be in a position to complete the handling of your application within the time limit of 15 working days provided under Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, as a large number of files would need to be assessed individually in order to retrieve the requested information.

Therefore, in this context, you are invited to find a fair solution in accordance with Article 6(3) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 and to specify the objective of your request, your specific interest in the requested documents, and to narrow down the scope of your request, so as to reduce it to a more manageable amount of documents.

We would appreciate if you get back to us by Friday, 26th June, noon (12:00).
