Well-designed, colour-coded front-of-pack nutritional labelling schemes can help busy shoppers to glean useful information at-a-glance. Research $^{[2]}$ conducted in several countries shows Nutri-Score is currently the best-performing scheme in both aiding consumers to compare the nutritional quality of foods across a range of products and to make healthier purchasing choices in the

Since France officially endorsed the scheme in 2017, Belgium, Spain, Germany, the Netherlands, Luxembourg and Switzerland have now recognised the effectiveness of Nutri-Score and have also recommended it in their territories. Nevertheless, as current EU food law only permits any such schemes to be voluntary, the full potential of the label to aid consumers remains unfulfilled.

We, the undersigned individuals and organisations, therefore call on the European Commission to adopt Nutri-Score as the basis for harmonization of front-of-pack nutritional labelling in the $EU^{\boxed{3}}$.
