European Maritime Day is a high profile event held annually to celebrate an integrated approach to maritime affairs. In 2013, the European Maritime Day Conference will focus on sustainable coastal and maritime tourism in the wider context of Blue Growth. It will be an occasion to reflect, at high level, on how to make Blue Growth happen through sustainable tourism, connectivity and coastal management. A special focus will be made on the Mediterranean Region and its maritime relation with neighbouring countries.



Dear Commissioner, dear Joe,

I apologise again for coming back to you so late – it has been a completely crazy ten days with no time to spare. I am sure your presentation for 24 April is ready to go, but I did want to get back to you with some of the promised stuff on MSP.

Firstly, you may have seen this on our website, but there is an updated Q&A on MSP which may be handy under any circumstances. I attach it here.

Second, here's a summary of points that I think are very important both in terms of context, and to manage questions from stakeholders:

One, the main objective is growth and employment. You are aware, I am sure, of the Blue growth initiative, and will probably have received some information on this in preparation of your intervention at Maritime Day. MSP supports Blue Growth because it creates stability, predictability and transparency for economic operators who are active or plan to be active at sea. With this legal instrument in place, all Member States have to clearly allocate space to economic activities, map where they are, and this creates a predictable environment.

Studies carried out by ourselves (economic benefits study, I enclose the doc here), and by some Member States (e.g. UK) suggest that the economic benefits could be massive.

I also enclose here a link to the study which we did on MSP in the Mediterranean specifically (there are too many documents there to reproduce here), the non-technical summary of which could be relevant.

Two, the rationale is that economic activities at sea, and in an offshore context, are expanding. They increase:

- Competition amongst activities (windfarms vs fishing and shipping, shipping vs. fishing, hydrocarbons vs. shipping and fishing, tourism vs. shipping and renewables, etc.)
- Safety concerns because of higher density (notably shipping, but not only)
- Environment impacts or conflicts between environmental uses (MPAs) and economic activities

It therefore makes sense and is increasingly necessary for Member States to have effective management tools in hand which allow to manage all of this offshore development coherently.

Three, these developments do not, by definition, stop at national borders, nor do marine ecosystems. It is therefore at least as important (and a significant argument for EU added-value) that these types of systems (MSP) are organised in such a way as to allow for cross-border cooperation.

Four, the objective is to provide a framework within which Member States can develop these systems, based on their individual administrative structures and processes, and without any interference on content by the EU. The proposal is designed to work in support of multiple objectives that already exist at EU level, and to ensure that these objectives are equally taken into account by Member States developing MSP – but there are no *new* substance objectives being set out.

Five, specifically for your audience, their interest should be that the management of shipping (in full respect of IMO competences etc. of course) through an integrated process applied throughout Member States, is something that complements their role nicely, as their primary task as I see it should be maintaining maritime safety.

Six, by the same token, it is necessary to ensure coherent management of coastal areas and to make sure that this management is linked to what is done in terms of spatial planning at sea. Integrated Coastal Management as we now call it is not about planning, but about developing strategies to coordinate management policies in the coastal zone; the reason why this is included in this legislative proposal in particular is because the 2002 Recommendation on ICZM did not achieve more than modest results, and by its very nature will not lead to any further progress on the issue, on the one hand. On the other hand, there are obligations for Mediterranean Member States stemming from the ICZM Protocol to the Barcelona Convention which was ratified by the EU, and is therefore binding on Mediterranean RU Member States, and this leads to an unbalanced situation in the EU.
