Subject: Request for access to documents

Dear Mr Breyer,

I refer to your above-referenced request under Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 regarding public access to European Parliament, Council and Commission documents, by which you request "access to a list of all opinions written by the Commission's Legal Service since 2019 which reflects the dates and subject matters of each opinion".

In reply to your application, I regret to inform you that the Commission's Legal Service is not in a position to deal with your request.

As specified in Article 2(3) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, the right of access as defined in that regulation applies only to existing documents in the possession of the institution. In this respect, the Court of Justice has confirmed in its judgment in Case C-491/15P² that "the right of access to documents of the institutions applies only to existing documents in the possession of the institution concerned and [...] that Regulation No 1049/2001 may not be relied upon to oblige an institution to create a document which does not exist".

The Advance Record System (ARES) is the document management tool common to all Commission services where both the documents originating from the Commission and those received by the institution are registered. However, neither this system nor any other internal system of the Legal Service allows for a list to be obtained of the legal opinions written by it.
