Subject: Your application for access to documents – Ref GestDem No 2021/4279

We refer to your e-mail of 28/06/2021 in which you make a request for access to documents, registered on 05/07/2021 under the above-mentioned reference number.

You request access to all documentation relating to the meetings held on 07/02/2021, 11/02/2021 and 14/06/2021 with SolarPower Europe.

Your application concerns the following documents:

1. Email correspondence related to the meeting held on 07/02/2021, ARES(2020)535646
2. Summary of the meeting held on 07/02/2021, ARES(2020)1006023
3. Email correspondence related to the meeting held on 11/02/2021, ARES(2021)4917949
4. Summary of the meeting held on 11/02/2021, ARES(2021)1325059
5. Email correspondence related to the meeting held on 14/06/2021, ARES(2021)4933633
6. Summary of the meeting held on 14/06/2021, ARES(2021)3906309

With regard to all the documents listed above, a complete disclosure of the identified documents is prevented by the exception concerning the protection of privacy and the integrity of the individual outlined in Article 4(1)(b) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, because they contain the following personal data:

- the names/initials and contact information of Commission staff members not pertaining to the senior management;
- the names/initials and contact details of other natural persons;
- handwritten signatures/abbreviated signatures of natural persons;
- other information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person.

In your application, you indicate that your address is in the United Kingdom. Transfers of personal data from the Commission to countries that are not members of the European Economic Area (EEA), or to international organisations are regulated under Chapter V of the Data Protection Regulation¹.

According to Article 47(1) of this Regulation, a transfer of personal data to a third country or an international organisation may take place where the Commission has decided that the third country, a territory or one or more specified sectors within that country, or the international organisation in question ensures an adequate level of

protection and where the personal data are transferred solely to allow tasks within the competence of the controller to be carried out.

Based on the information available, the country of your residence is recognised by the Commission as ensuring an adequate level of protection. However, we would further like to inform you that Article 9(1)(b) of the Data Protection Regulation does not allow the transmission of these personal data, except if you prove that it is necessary to have the data transmitted to you for a specific purpose in the public interest and where there is no reason to assume that the legitimate interests of the data subject might be prejudiced. In your request, you do not express any particular interest to have access to these personal data nor do you put forward any arguments to establish the necessity to have the data transmitted for a specific purpose in the public interest.

Consequently, I conclude that, pursuant to Article 4(1)(b) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, access cannot be granted to the personal data contained in the requested documents, as the need to obtain access thereto for a purpose in the public interest has not been substantiated and there is no reason to think that the legitimate interests of the individuals concerned would not be prejudiced by disclosure of the personal data concerned.
