Topics for discussion:

1. For forerunner companies carbon pricing in the context of ETS has created a predictable frame for future investments. To harness this remarkable success as an example in other areas CLC has launched the [Call on Carbon initiative](#) that is signed by around 25% of global businesses. How EU plans to bring carbon pricing further and what kinds of support CLC members and Call on carbon signatures could provide?
2. Companies see challenges in the availability of competent workforce. Lack of competences in many levels from heat pump installers to world's best green solution developers is already now restricting action. In the long term this might risk investments and lock the full potential of green transition. Public-private collaboration is needed.
3. Increased pressure to land-use is emerging in several fields. Due to trade-offs but also synergies among different land use options, CLC views that the issue should be considered in a holistic way to take in the account the needs of carbon sinks and food production, energy infrastructure and production, biodiversity and forest industries. That will be a difficult but needed systemic exercise for EU, for the governments and for companies.
