Report of the First Round of EU-India FTA Negotiations 27 June – 1 July 2022, New Delhi

The first round of EU-India FTA negotiations took place in New Delhi between 27 June and 1 July 2022, with parallel negotiations taking place on investment protection and geographical indications (GIs). The round took place in a very good and constructive atmosphere, and covered the 18 text proposals tabled by the EU.

Out-or-scope
The main thrust of the round can be summarised as follows:
 India accepted to discuss all 18 chapters proposed by the EU, and the talks took place on the basis of the EU-proposed texts – with the exception of trade remedies, for which India shared an alternative text just prior to the round. However, India announced the submission of alternative language across EU texts, including full alternative chapters in certain areas Art.4(3) 1st subparagraph


