#### **Synopsis:**

The revision of the Renewable Energy Directive is an opportunity to reconsider the contribution of sustainable and renewable liquid fuels to the transport, industrial and building sectors. This revision should however be conducted in a technology open way, allowing for the use of all options with proven emission-reduction credentials, while also meeting sustainability criteria, to ensure that the highest levels of ambition are achievable.

But what would it take to boost the role of sustainable, advanced biofuels and waste/residue-based fuels together with Renewable Fuels from Non-Biological Origin (RFNBO) and Recycled Carbon Fuels (RCF) in transport? Would it be possible to enlarge the pool of eligible feedstocks that are proven to reduce greenhouse gas emission & to meet sustainability criteria? What about sustainable feedstock availability in the 2030 timeframe and beyond? What regulatory framework to enable investments and new jobs in the value chain of agriculture and fuels sectors?
