Please find attached the summary diagram and table of PAN Europe's impact assessment showing which pesticides are endocrine disrupting chemicals. We used all available data, both industry's dossiers and independent scientific literature and assessed which pesticides should be banned according to the Pesticide Regulation (chemicals with endocrine properties that may cause adverse effects) and which ones are likely to be banned according to the commission's options (as explained in the EDCs-Roadmap).

Unlike the exaggerated claims by the industry and farmers, seven, four or zero pesticides will likely be regulated by the Commission. We also carried on an in-depth analysis on alternatives to these pesticides (attached) and we also evaluated the flaws of the industry-reports that claim huge costs and yield losses if such pesticides are banned (attached).
