## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000 REQUEST REF: FOI 0812-16

Thank you for your email of 21 August asking for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. You asked for:

I would like to refine my request to ask what nationality rules does the FCO apply in regards to staff appointments? For example, EU, Commonwealth, UK nationals or anyone who has a right to work in Belgium?

I can confirm that the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) does hold the information you require.

The Aliens' Employment Act 1955 makes it an absolute requirement that all staff recruited to the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) on UK terms and conditions must be UK nationals. The FCO therefore employs UK Nationals, or dual nationals where one of those nationalities is UK.

Our overseas missions recruit locally for some positions. They are governed by local labour laws and not UK legislation. Applicants resident in either the country of the vacancy, in the UK or a third country are eligible to apply and must have the right to work and reside in the country of the vacancy.

Once an FOI request is answered, it is considered to be in the public domain. To promote transparency, we may now publish the response and any material released on <u>gov.uk</u> in the <u>FOI releases</u> section. All personal information in the letter will be removed before publishing.

The copies of information being supplied to you continue to be protected by the Copyright, Designs and Patents Act 1988. You are free to use it for your own purposes, including any non-commercial research you are doing and for the purposes of news reporting. Any other re-use, for example commercial publication, would require the permission of the copyright holder. Most documents supplied by the FCO will have been produced by government

officials and will be protected by Crown Copyright. To re-use Crown Copyright documents please consult the Open Government Licence v3on the National Archives website.

Information you receive which is not subject to Crown Copyright continues to be protected by the copyright of the person, or organisation, from which the information originated. You must ensure that you gain their permission before reproducing any third party (non-Crown Copyright) information.

I hope you are satisfied with this reply. If you are not content with the outcome of your complaint, you may then apply directly to the Information Commissioner for a decision. Generally, the Information Commissioner cannot make a decision unless you have exhausted the complaints procedure provided by the FCO.
