Action Plan for the Accelerated Implementation of ERDF and CF in Slovenia

On the initiative of the European Commission and in agreement with the Slovene Government Office for Development and Cohesion Policy (GODC) the Implementation Task Force held a meeting on 21st January 2015 in Ljubljana.

There are currently over 50 projects being carried out within the frame of OP DETI which will ensure a continuation of the same implementation and absorption trend as in 2014. The list of current on-going projects, with both the amounts allocated and the amounts already paid out per project is updated monthly and can be found on the GODC website: www.svrk.gov.si/si/kako_crpamo_eu_sredstva.

After a review of the current situation and possible actions that could be taken, the following actions were agreed on to be implemented in order to speed up the implementation of 2007 – 2013 programmes and to be better prepared for the 2014 – 2020 period.

Action descriptions

First action to be taken: Reprogramming OP DETI

In accordance with the Article 33 of Regulation 1083/2006 due to **»implementation difficulties.** « Managing Authority will in the year 2015 propose modification of OP DETI.

Following steps are necessary to reprogram the OP DETI.

Second action to be taken (only if needed): Reprogramming OP SRDP

In assessment of the Operational Programme for Strengthening Regional Development Potentials (OP SRDP) implementation Managing Authority (MA) predicts possible discrepancies between planned payments from the Union to the priority and the effective Funds implementation under that priority could occur. The latter largely derived from performance of financial corrections as a result of corrective measures after the checks or audits instruction and in this context especially under OP SRDP priority no. 1. The financial corrections under this priority, taking into account checks and audits in the field of development centres of the Slovenian economy, could be in the range of 40 mio EUR.

In the case of unforeseen circumstances, that in advance it was not possible to predict, MA leaves the possibility of OP SRDP revision.

Third action to be taken: Quarterly Reporting

Slovenia has standardised quarterly reporting on the 2007-2013 EU Cohesion Policy funds absorption.

The Quarterly Report on the 2007-2013 EU Cohesion Policy funds absorption presents the state of pay in terms of the 2007-2013 EU Cohesion Policy funds absorption for the quarterly period under the Operational Programme for Strengthening Regional Development Potentials for the Period 2007–2013 (OP SRDP), the Operational Programme for Human Resources

Development for the Period 2007-2013 (OP HRD) and the Operational Programme for Development of Environmental and Transport Infrastructure for the Period 2007-2013 (OP DETI).

The report is prepared on the basis of data of the Government Office for Development and European Cohesion Policy (GODC) as well as the ministries, participating the EU Cohesion Policy implementation, namely the Ministry of Education, Science and Sport, Ministry of Infrastructure, Ministry of the Environment and Spatial Planning, Ministry of Culture, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Public Administration, Ministry of Justice, Ministry of Labour, Family, Social Affairs and Equal Opportunities, Ministry of Economic Development and Technology and the Ministry of Finance.

Fourth action to be taken: Secured Financial Allocations in Adopted Budget for 100% Disbursement of OPs

Slovenia has been struggling with modest economic growth just like many other Member States; however, according to the latest indicators, this economic growth has been very unstable in largest markets which are of substantial importance for Slovenia's trade. Slovenia and its EU counterparts are obliged to adhere to the Stability and Growth Pact which ensures fiscal discipline and sets reference values for national budget deficit and public debt. Economic and financial crisis in Slovenia, just like everywhere else, caused a huge slowdown and compromised spending of cohesion policy funds (especially Cohesion Fund) in the past years, but Slovenia was able to take measures that enabled quite a substantial improvement, especially what regards cohesion policy area through accelerating investments in the environmental and transport sector (especially in 2014).

To go ahead with the investment cycle and therefore with the positive effect it is of crucial importance that there are sufficient EU funds planned in the 2015 state budget which will enable the investment cycle to continue and result in full absorption of EU Funds for the 2007-2013 financial perspective.

Fifth action to be taken: Administrative Capacity

A part of the above-mentioned Action Plan was also the optimisation of Technical Assistance priorities under all the Operational Programmes. These budgets were under-spent because of the austerity measures in the framework of the state budget. The Action Plan enabled stakeholders (ministries and other public authorities) to reinforce a number of civil servants with management and implementation tasks under the Cohesion Policy programmes.

The Managing Authority approved additional 32 employments for the OP DETI and 9 for the OP SRDP for the period up to 30 November 2015. The hiring of new staff is in its final stages.

Sixth action to be taken: EIA Assessment

- The EIA Working Group is an inter-ministerial group of environmental experts which was established in April 2014 by the Government of the Republic of Slovenia in order to assess the compliance of the projects that received the European cohesion policy support under the programmes OP DETI and OP SRDP with the EIA Directive requirements.
- The whole screening process will concern approximately 60 projects under OP DETI and approximately 125 projects under OP SRDP.
