I am writing to invite you to speak at the next Chatham House **London Conference**, which will take place on **Thursday 16 and Friday 17 June 2016** at the St Pancras Renaissance Hotel in London.

Chatham House's annual flagship London Conference, launched in 2014, brings together approximately 200 senior decision-makers in the policy, business, civil society and academic spheres to debate the systemic risks facing the world as a result of the deepening process of globalization.

In 2016, the conference will focus on the theme of '**Re-Defining Borders: Challenges to Security, Stability and Resilience**'.
