As a follow-up of the MoA/HRF workshop organised last year, the workshop agenda, final report and presentations have been published on ECHA website (http://echa.europa.eu/en/view-article/-/journal_content/title/workshop-on-mode-of-action-and-human-relevance-framework-under-clh-bp-and-ppp-regulations). In addition, as you may know, there was a strong support for the use of guidance and templates as developed by WHO/IPCS for weight of evidence analysis and transparent documentation of MoA/HRF. WHO/IPCS templates are now available in Word format at <http://echa.europa.eu/web/guest/support/guidance-on-reach-and-clp-implementation/formats>.

In addition to the above, we are of the opinion that it would be good to provide examples of WHO/IPCS templates available to everyone with some 'pilot' cases. The benefit of having these examples will surely help other actors to better understand the terminology, principles and content we are looking at. They will also support DS of CLH dossiers that contain mechanistic information. The pilots should be in our view substances with convincing MoA data that have been recently adopted/peer-reviewed by RAC & EFSA (e.g. sulfoxaflor and fluopyram).

These examples may be e.g. circulated to the relevant actors and published on ECHA website as provided, i.e. without any consultation, peer-review or formatting. In terms of timelines, we suggest April-May so that we can report something at RAC-33.

We would be happy to discuss with you the above proposal.
