We refer to your e-mail dated 15 September 2017 in which you make a request for access to documents, registered on 15 September 2017 under the above-mentioned reference number.

- 2) minutes and other reports of these meetings;
- 3) all correspondence (including emails) between DG Trade officials and/or representatives (including the Commissioner and the Cabinet) and Volkswagen Aktiengesellschaft (Volkswagen AG) in which the Japan-EU Free Trade Agreement JEFTA, the US-EU trade relations and/or the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (TTIP) were discussed (between September 2015 and today, i.e. 15.09.2017)."

We understand that your request concerns individual meetings between Volkswagen Aktiengesellschaft (Volkswagen AG) and DG Trade officials and/or representatives (including the Commissioner and the Cabinet) and in which the Japan-EU Free Trade Agreement JEFTA, the US-EU trade relations and/or the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (TTIP) were discussed, which took place between September 2015 and 15 September 2017.

We regret to inform you that DG Trade has not identified any such meeting and therefore we have not identified any documents corresponding to your request
