Second key messages

Palm oil + CEPA

EU imports of palm oil decreasing

- EU market access is already very important, as IDN palm oil (and derived products) exports to the EU already represent around 70% of total IDN exports of agri products to the EU. EU import duties are relatively low and 50% of EU imports of palm oil from IDN already happen with no duty. Total EU imports of palm oil represent more than 3 Bio €.
- Evolution of imports during the last years shows a positive trend even if 2015 figure is somewhat lower than in the 2014 record.

Palm oil market access in CEPA; will import duties be removed?

- Take note of IDN offensive interest on palm oil.

[Article 4.1 (a) - International relations]

- As negotiations will be conducted on the principle of single undertaking we cannot take positions at this stage on individual products without seeing bigger picture.
- CEPA should also be the occasion to diversify IDN exports as the potential is there.

EU should stop anti-palm oil campaigns and in particular labelling of food products as "palm oil free"

- The EU legislation aims at informing consumers about the food they purchase and require the indication of the type of vegetable oil/fat. It applies to all oils without distinction.
- Provided the claim is not false and does not mislead the consumer (e.g. on health impacts) the EU cannot prevent a manufacturer from stating that a product is free of certain ingredient.
