Thanks so much for the message and for the talk on the phone.

As I mentioned, we have a number of concerns, and we are discussing with our colleagues in DG CNECT the need for EU coordination.

For your information, the COM position on the liability of online intermediaries on illegal content is enshrined in the recent COM communication of 28 September 2017. The need for proactive measures by intermediaries in detecting illegal content (ie without requiring a court order) is also part of EU policies in the field of terrorist content and child sexual abuse material.

You will have realised that the COE recommendation goes in the opposite direction.
