

UNITED NATIONS CONVENTION ON TRANSPARENCY IN TREATY-BASED INVESTOR-STATE ARBITRATION (NEW YORK, 2014) (THE "MAURITIUS CONVENTION ON TRANSPARENCY")

Reservations:

- Specific investment treaty
 - Specific set of arbitral rules other than UNCITRAL

Mandate of Working Group III (2017)

"The Commission entrusted Working Group III with a broad mandate to work on the possible reform of investor-State dispute settlement (ISDS). In line with the UNCITRAL process, Working Group III would, in discharging that mandate, ensure that deliberations, while benefiting from the widest possible breadth of available expertise from all stakeholders, would be government-led with high-level input from all governments, consensus-based and transparent.

Mandate of Working Group III (2017)

The Working Group would proceed to: first, identify and consider concerns regarding ISDS; second, consider whether reform was desirable in light of any identified concerns; and third, if the Working Group were to conclude that reform was desirable, develop any relevant solutions to be recommended to the Commission. (...)."
