














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Subject: Meeting report: Roundtable on ISDS reform, Zagreb, 6 December 2018

**Meeting report: Participation in a roundtable discussion on the “future of investment arbitration” as part of the 26th Croatian Arbitration Days, Zagreb, 6 December 2018**

I participated in a roundtable discussion on the “future of investment arbitration” as part of the 26th Croatian Arbitration Days held in Zagreb, Croatia, on 6 and 7 December 2018.

Following a general presentation of ongoing reform discussions by , lecturer at the University of Bedfordshire, I presented the EU’s approach to the reform of investment dispute resolution, both in the EU’s bilateral agreements (ICS) and the EU’s efforts to work towards the creation of a multilateral investment court as part of the on-going discussions on ISDS reform with UNCITRAL Working Group III.

The following presentations by  and  focussed on the intra-EU aspects of investment law and arbitration and discussed the consequences and possible future developments resulting from the CJEU’s judgment C-284/16 (*Achmea*). The panel discussions closed with a presentation of the views of the government of Croatia (, Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs) about intra- and extra-EU aspect of investment law and dispute settlement.
